Dear Chairman Cummings:

On behalf of the managers and supervisors currently serving our nation in the federal government and whose interests are represented by the Federal Managers Association (FMA), we extend our strongest endorsement for your legislation that would protect federal employee health benefits in the event of another government shutdown. Both the Ensuring FEHBP Coverage During Shutdowns Act (H.R. 2003) and the Ensuring FEDVIP and FLTCIP Coverage During Shutdowns Act (H.R. 2004) are commonsense, reasonable bills that would give much peace of mind to employees.

FMA urges Congress and the administration to work together to prevent future lapses in appropriations. However, in the event of future shutdowns, feds should never have to be concerned about losing health benefits and services, including processing coverage for new dependents, due to circumstances beyond their control. H.R. 2003 and H.R. 2004 would give a measure of relief to feds and their families and we appreciate your leadership on this issue. We are grateful both bills have strong bipartisan, bicameral support, and will work with you to get them passed and signed into law.
